Marriage should be honored by all, and the marriage bed kept pure, for God will judge the adulterer and all the sexually immoral. Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." So we say with confidence, "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can man do to me?" Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Reflection from the Catechism: Who Art in heaven

The symbol of the heavens refers us back to the mystery of the covenant we are living when we pray to our Father. He is in heaven, his dwelling place; the Father's house is our homeland. Sin has exiled us from the land of the covenant, (cf. Gen. 3) but conversion of heart enables us to return to the Father, to heaven. (Luke 15:18-21) In Christ, then, heaven and earth are reconciled, (Isaiah 45:8) for the Son alone "descended from heaven" and causes us to ascend there with him, by his Cross, Resurrection, and Ascension. (Jn 3:13, Eph. 4:9-10) (CCC,2795)

When the Church prays "our Father who art in heaven," she is professing that we are the People of God, already seated "with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus" and "hidden with Christ in God;" (Eph 2:6; Col 3:3) yet at the same time, "here indeed we groan, and long to put on our heavenly dwelling." (2 Cor 5:2)

Seasonal Prayer: Canticle of the Blood by St. Maria de Mattias

February 4 - Feast of St. Maria de Mattias Foundress of the Adorers of the Blood of Christ

Come, let us adore Christ, the Son of God, who has redeemed us with his blood.

Clap your hands, all you peoples, sing unto God with a voice of jubilation.

Silent Reflection

Meditation: (*Spe Salvi*, The true shape of Christian hope)

Every generation has the task of engaging anew in the arduous search for the right way to order human affairs; this task is never simply completed. Yet every generation must also make its own contribution to establishing convincing structures of freedom and of good, which can help the following generation as a guideline for the proper use of human freedom; hence, always within human limits, they provide a certain guarantee also for the future. In other words: good structures help, but of themselves they are not enough. Man can never be redeemed simply from outside.²⁵

It is not science that redeems man: man is redeemed by love. This applies even in terms of this present world. When someone has the experience of a great love in his life, this is a moment of "redemption" which gives a new meaning to his life... The human being needs unconditional love. He needs the certainty which makes him say: "neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (*Rom* 8:38-39). If this absolute love exists, with its absolute certainty, then—only then—is man "redeemed", whatever should happen to him in his particular circumstances. This is what it means to say: Jesus Christ has "redeemed" us. Through him we have become certain of God, a God who is not a remote "first cause" of the world, because his only-begotten Son has become man and of him everyone can say: "I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (*Gal* 2:20). 26
